A California Transition Program an Overview of the WorkAbility Program

Oxnard Union High School District in coordination with Ventura County SELPA uses funding from the California Department of Education for WorkAbility to provide comprehensive pre-employment skills training, employment placement and follow-up for high school students in special education who are making the transition from school to work, independent living, and postsecondary education or training. Program services are tailored to individual student needs, abilities, and interests.

There are no minimum hours, and services may range from brief training in pre-employment skills or coaching in unsubsidized employment to subsidization of wages in try-out employment.
